### CSA Report - Mr. Strong

- LinkIt! Assessment In 1<sup>st</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade, administered a LinkIt Assessment. This assessment is not for a grade. The assessment gives teachers information about where the kids' strengths and weaknesses are. Language Arts grouped based on skill levels. By using this program, faculty can determine what students should be together in a group. DRA, SRI, PARCC, ASK results are all in Real Time.

Treasurer Diana Pell went over expenses and income items. Book Fair budgeted income was \$1200 and we raised \$1,267.40. The Pumpkin Patch budget was \$2,500. On the day we raised \$1538 plus pumpkins coming in and expenses going out.



### Programs/Fundraisers

- Pumpkin Patch recap and discussion Carrie K. Thank you to all who volunteered. Great feedback all day. She is surprised we didn't sell all the pumpkins. The Toilet Paper Toss made the most money. Popcorn is a good prize. Carrie took a lot of notes the day of. She thinks we should order the same amount next year (were told it would be about 200, ended up being 156). We sold about 100 pumpkins. Sense of community could be felt throughout the event. Two community members/parents recommended consolidating all community Halloween events into one (Chili cook off, Monsterville Farmers Market, Pumpkin Patch) We can use the generator next year to set the bake sale table up in a different section so it looks like it's part of the market. Christina Hunter – When the Junior Women's Society did the pumpkin patch, they started at \$3000 and was up to \$6000 the final year. They used to do it at the Community Center during baseball and all concessions were sold to baseball parents. Chick-Fil-A sandwiches and hot dogs were included in food. They did a costume parade for the kids. At the time, the Public Events Committee paid for half the pumpkins. Holli C. – Her neighbor said it was great. Marisa T. on behalf of Nicole K. – something competitive for the older kids. Mummy wrap? Bobbing for apples or apple cider donuts. Bill as the "Merchantville Pumpkin Patch" sponsored by the Merchantville PTA. Jen D. – Have every class make a craft that can be a decoration. Something on a clothesline. See your child's craft on display. The crafts can make up a portion of the decoration. Rebecca O. – Bigger sandwich signs on some of the main corners pointing toward the area. Some people couldn't find it. Jen/Rebecca – does it have to be tickets for baked goods and food? Marisa shared participant feedback that a lot of people were expecting to pay with cash.
- Charleston Wrap (Rebecca O. feels like we raised way more than was budgeted for Charleston Wrap). Mrs. Turan shared a concern that the products are not made in USA. Rebecca had previously look into this and found out from the company that all gift wrap is designed and produced in the USA, but they get their wood that makes the paper in another country (Canada). So they cannot say that it is made in the USA. Innisbrook still makes wrapping paper, but they do not sell for fundraisers. They are a wholesale company that supplies paper to other fundraising companies.
- Holli C. Do we do other fundraisers cheesecake? Food sale? In the past, the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade has done the cheesecake fundraiser. We are open to other fundraisers.

- Broadway Trip Lisa on behalf of Loredana R. Could anyone volunteer to be contact person on playground after school for people to give money to? Marisa the money can go into PTA mailbox. Payment is due January 2. Deadline to confirm is before Christmas break. Show is



- February 17. Lisa is helping Loredana finish flyer. Post on Konstella and Facebook. Marisa Discussed the possibility of making small snack bags for the day of for the trips to and from.
- Talent Show Susie S. 1<sup>st</sup> time doing show the show and has questions. Cannot get all permission slips from kids and would like suggestions on how to procure. She does not have contact information for some of the parents. Marisa was able to find some contact info on Konstella and Ms. Goff will look into the remaining children. Her Goal is to keep rehearsals pretty tight and to a minimum so they are not at auditorium all day every day.
